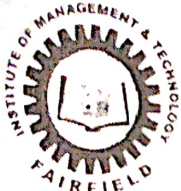


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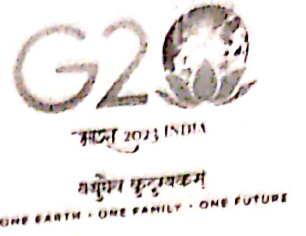


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Report on Workshop

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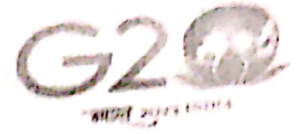

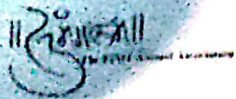
REPORT

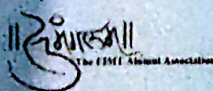

"Advanced Analytical Tools in Data Science"

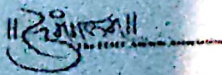
16th & 17th May 2023

This workshop provided hands-on training to understand some useful concepts of data science and statistical analysis by using Microsoft Access, Advanced Excel, SPSS and R and which are the most widely used in the field of Data Science across the world. The main objective was to make the participants familiar with the emerging field of data science along with the preparation of data for extracting valuable insights from vast amount of structured and unstructured data.

The Session on Day -1 i.e. 16th May 2023 commenced with the welcoming and introduction of all the guest speakers by the host Ms. Anushka and Ms. Ishani, student of BBA (G) 2nd semester. He also informed the audience about the fact that the mistakes done in the memorial could also be corrected in the oral submissions and knowing all the issues and being on point with the answers so given to the judges.



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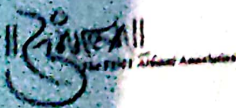
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Day 1: Report of "Yog Shivar"

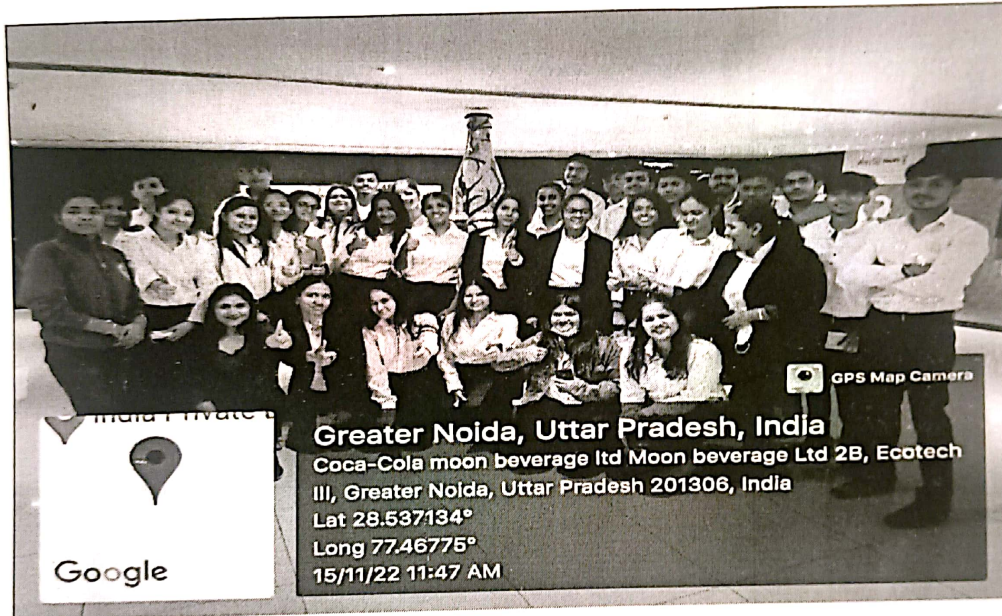

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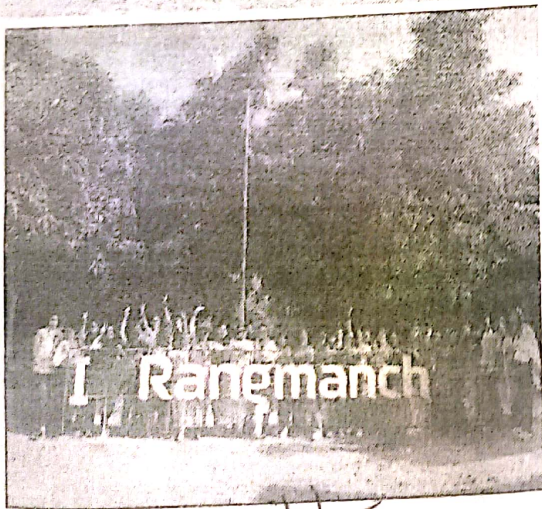
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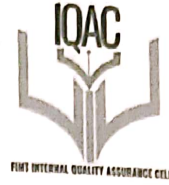
REPORT ON PICNIC TO RANGMANCH FARMS

Report on NCERT Visit

School of Education- Fairfield Institute of Management and Technology (FIMT) had organised an educational visit to NCERT, New Delhi on 18th October 2022. The total number of students visited were 57 among which 40 students plus two B.Ed. faculties were board from college bus and 17 students came directly to NCERT as they lived nearby to NCERT. All the visitors ^{assigned by} were reached NCERT at 10:00 AM. Dr. Deepty was the incharge of this visit at NCERT. There were four session that took place in different halls. All the students and faculties attended the first session on "CIET" (Central Institute of Educational Technology), on Digital Initiatives of MoE, GoI and many more. The first session was ^{Taken} given by Dr. Deepty Ma'am. She introduced NCERT, CIET, SCERT and told about many mobile apps which can be used by teachers for students so that the lecture becomes interactive and interesting. Pupil- Teachers can use audio-visual aids where the content is available free of future teachers and for anyone who is accessing it can visit the website portal it is available free of cost. She also spoke about 'Nishtha' where all the modules, PowerPoint presentation are available so that the teachers can look and access them easily. In the session she told us about that there is FLN Foundation Literacy Numeracy which is training program for children. 'Diksha' these are the digital platform for information for knowledge of sharing and teacher can make assessment for the students whatever she had taught to the class then make understanding what are the obstacles that the children in the class are facing which can be resolved using these apps and providing the content in an innovative manner to class.

At 11.00 am they offered all of us refreshment. And at 11.30 am second session started. The second session was ^{by} given by Dr. Nidhi Singh Ma'am. She told us about 'Integration of ICT in Education' she explained the ADDIE model where A stands for analysis, D ^{First stands} is for designing, D ^{Second stands for} is to develop, I is for implementing and E is to evaluate. It was very informative session on the tools which pupil- teacher can use while teaching and make his/her class factual. She make understood about the various social science tools like 'Bhuvan, Marble KDE, Google earth etc'. In the session the students got to know about the types of eContent like there were e-text, image, graph, chart, videos, infographic, audio etc.

The third session was based on Experiential Learning, it is newly established lab in CIET, where a movie related "Sunita Williams" was being presented using VR Cameras and everything seems to be real while looking into



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On 29th March at 10:30 A.M. students reached at common effluent treatment plant at Rithala. The visit started from the initial tank where the Domestic waste water of Delhi is collected.

Mr. Ajay Kumar, the in charge officer of water treatment plant guided all the students about the entire process of water treatment plant.

Screening & Primary Treatment

First unit of water treatment plant is screening, this is first step in waste water treatment process. Screening involves the removal of large objects for example cotton buds, plastics, diapers, rags, sanitary items, face wipes, broken bottles or bottle tops that in one way or another may damage the equipment.

This process involves the separation of macrobiotic solid matter from the wastewater. Primary treatment is done by pouring the wastewater into big tanks for the solid matter to settle at the surface of the tanks which is removed by large scrappers at the center of the cylindrical tanks. The remaining water is then pumped for secondary treatment.

Secondary Treatment

The next step of the treatment process is secondary clarifier. The water from the primary tank is transported to the secondary clarifier for adding chemicals such as lime and alum to reduce the PH of water.

Aeration Tank & Disinfection unit

The settled wastewater enters aeration tanks where air is blown into the liquid to provide oxygen for mixing and to promote the growth of micro-organisms.

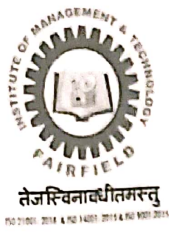
Some of this sludge is recycled to the inlet of the aeration tank to maintain the biomass, hence the name for the process activated sludge. The remainder is pumped to anaerobic digester for further treatment.

The next steps for wastewater treatment plants use disinfection for treatment to reduce pathogens, which are micro-organisms which can pose a risk to human health.

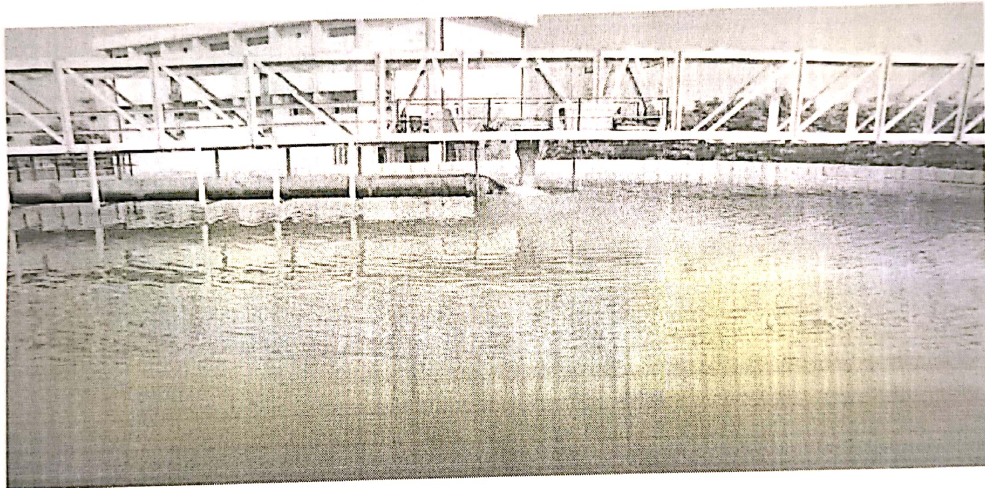

REPORT ON PARLIAMENT VISIT

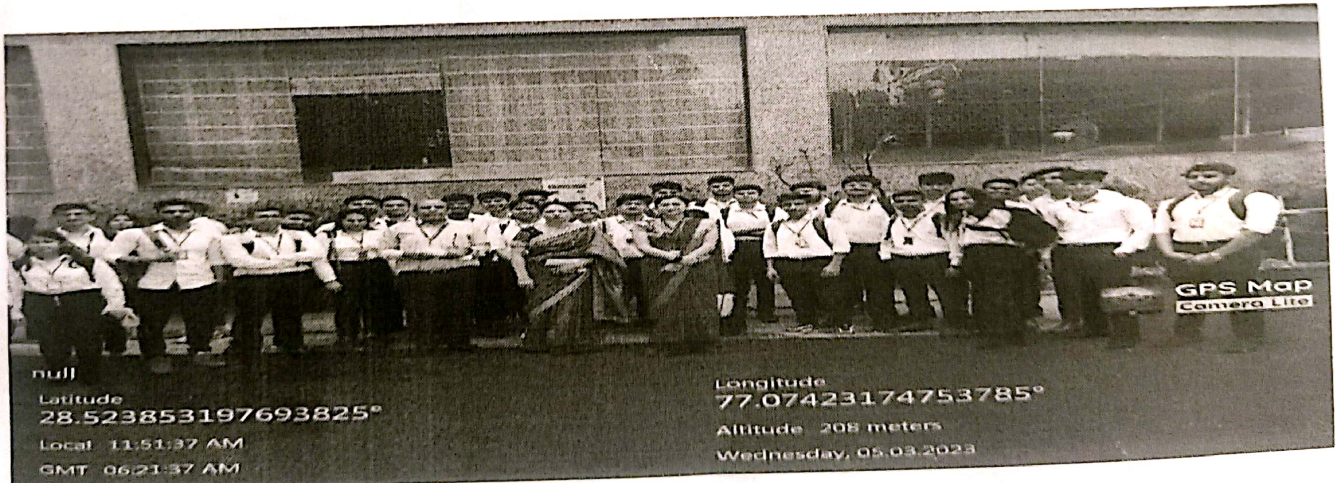
Date: 3rd May 2023

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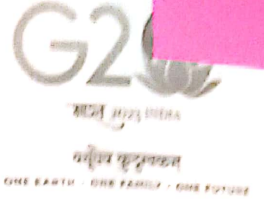


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Report on Visit

Indian Steel Summit

Date: 25th May 2023

FIMT- Career Counseling Cell organized a visit to attend Indian Steel Summit at Taj Place New Delhi. 15 students from (B.Com (H) & BBA (G) along With Dr. Suman Yadav attended this event on 25th May 2023.

Purpose of Summit : Enhancing Competitiveness & Overcoming Challenges was the key theme at the summit. State Govt. Agencies and 14 private Steel Organization submitted funds for Sustainable Raw Materials Supply for Indian Steel Sector, Enhancing Export competitiveness in Steel Sector: From Local to Global and Steel manufacturing through New Age technology and green growth of Indian steel industry was held at the summit where key stakeholders from the government and industry participated.

Addressing the summit, Mr. Atul Singh, Vice President, AM/NS Khopoli Ltd, said "India will be a hub of growth and a magnet for consumption, investment and trade. This makes it imperative for steel as an industry remain competitive and prepared to attract trade flows from all over the world. We must be open to the idea that disruption within the steel industry can also come from technologies which are assumed to be non-mainstream. The policy decision and choice we make today will have an impact on how we as an industry compete over the next 25 years."

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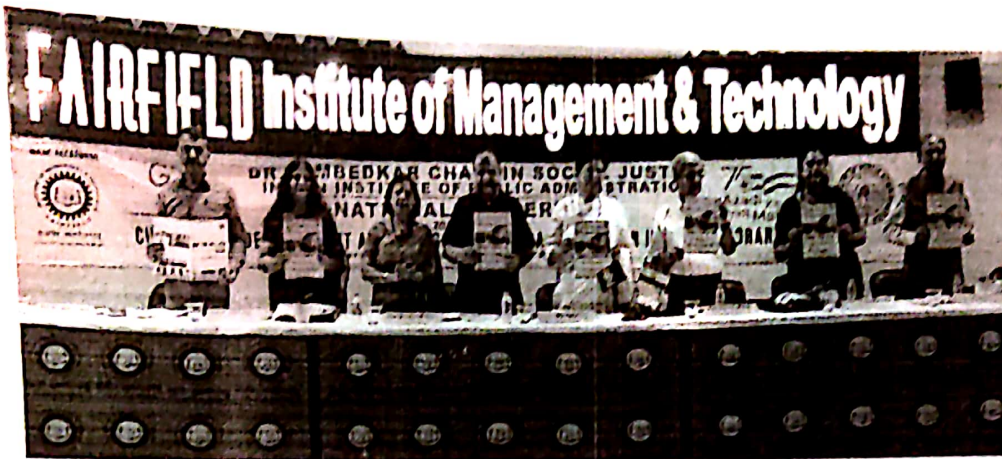
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TECHNICAL SESSIONS

The conference witnessed overwhelming response from all over India. Technical sessions were divided into two parts: Offline & Online, which were held simultaneously.

Technical Session I (Offline)

The session was conducted in two parts-12:00 Noon till 1:30 PM and 2:30 PM till 3:30 PM

The first part of the session was chaired by Prof. (Dr.) M. Afzal Wani, Former Dean USLLS, GGSIPU & Former Member LCI and Co-Chaired by Dr. Zubair A. Khan, Assistant Professor, USLLS, GGSIPU and Prof. (Dr.) Devinder Singh, Chairperson, Department of Law, Punjab University, Chandigarh

8 papers were presented in this session. The session started with presentation of a paper title "Structural Changes in Indian Legal Education". The next paper discussed in detail the relevance of political science in the study of legal education. A very pertinent issue of the need for legal education to change with changes in technology was also discussed by another participant and one more participant took it one step further by urging on the need to completely redefine and rejuvenate the pedagogy. A paper highlighted the role of women in the legal profession and the issues and challenges they face due to their gender.

Technical Session II (Online)

The session started at 12:00 Noon on Zoom Platform. The session was Chaired by Dr. Archana Sarma, Head of the Department, Northcap University and Co—Chaired by Dr. Abhinandan Bassi, Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab.

11 papers were presented in this session. The first paper lead to a very important discussion, i.e., how to design the curriculum so as to increase employability. Keeping the theme in mind, few papers discussed the impact of NEP on legal education and examined it from a linguistic lens.
